Beech Hosts the 9th Annual "Jazz on the Ave" Music Fest



Beech Community Services will host the 9th annual "Jazz on the Ave" Music Fest featuring Philly Soul Stock on **Saturday, August 15, 2015** from 12-8pm. In the event of rain, the festival will be held on the following day, August 16. This free family-friendly event will stretch along 4 blocks on Cecil B. Moore Avenue from Broad to 17th Streets.

Each year, the concert festival continues to grow with thousands attending each year from the tri-state area including local celebrities like Bernard Hopkins, boxing champion and North Philadelphia native. The festival is a must-attend for long-time community residents and people that have moved away from the community. "The annual event is like a 'family reunion' of some sort," states long-time resident Mary Galloway. "Many of my friends and I get together once a year at the festival to enjoy the good music, indulge in the delicious food and, of course, to enjoy each others company." The day's festivities will include craft food vendors, social service agencies, free health and wellness screenings, HIV & Hepatitis C testing and blood

& glucose screenings provided by Health Care professionals from Stephen Klein and Drexel University Health Care network. Additionally, there will be a Kids Zone with childrens activities including a moon bounce, face painting, rock climbing, pottery making with the Clay Studio and other fun and exciting things to keep the little ones busy.

The highlight of the festival is the live music on two stages. Philly's own Jeff Bradshaw and Friends will headline the main stage at Broad Street and Cecil B. Moore Avenue with special guests Eric Roberson, Syleena Johnson and Elle Varner. Also performing on the main stage are Suzanne Burgess, Lee Mo featuring Vertical Current, Worldtown Sound System and Abstract Truth. The Modern Legends Drill Team will open the festival at noon with a live performance followed by the All Star Boyz dance troop. Some of Philly's most respected radio personalities, Patty Jackson, Dyana Williams, Loraine Ballard Morrill and Jeff Duperon will host the event.

An added addition to this year's festival is Philly Soul Stock. In its 7th year, Philly Soul Stock has served many Philadelphia communities by highlighting up and coming artists from across the Delaware Valley. Philly Soul Stock provides a professional soundstage for Philadelphia's young arts community, educating youth on instrumentation, vocal techniques and to promote youth musicianship. Community Health & Wellness Center

The Stephen Klein Wellness Center (SKWC) is a 28,000 square-foot integrated health and wellness facility that is committed to addressing the health and wellness needs of people who are currently homeless, formerly homeless or living in the North Philadelphia community.

The Center is a partnership between Project HOME, Thomas Jefferson University Hospitals, Inc., Jefferson Medical College Department of Family and Community Medicine, the Middleton Partnership and Stephen Klein. It expands the health care services that have been provided to formerly homeless and low-income people in North Philadelphia. This vital project leverages the support of both public and private funders to end homelessness through affordable housing, opportunities for employment, health care and education. The SKWC will include primary care, behavioral health, dental care, a pharmacy, on-site legal counseling and a Philadelphia Freedom Valley YMCA with various services.

While the pharmacy and dental care services will be up-and-running, currently available services include primary care, behavioral health, nurse care management, individual/couples/group counseling, peer-led outreach and care coordination, healing touch, on-site legal counseling, HIV testing and assistance with applying for health insurance benefits.

Loan Repair Program for Philadelphia Homeowners

The Renovate & Repair Loan Program (R&R) is designed to meet serious housing issues for many of Pennsylvania's homeowners: how to make their home a healthy, comfortable place and a financial asset. The R&R Loan Program collaboration between PHFA & Beech has been developed to assist homeowners in avoiding common pitfalls in home improvement projects such as homeowners being taken advantage of by unscrupulous lenders and contractors, poor quality and unnecessary repairs.

Keystone Renovate & Repair Loan Program (R&R Loan) is to help:

- Prevent homeowners from becoming victims of unscrupulous lending practices (i.e., high interest rates and costs, more money borrowed than needed, pre-payment penalties, etc.).
- Homeowners prioritize their home repair spending so that the work they are having done is what the homeowner really needs. Improve Pennsylvania's aging housing stock for its current residents and future generations.

R&R Loan can be used to:

- Pay for repairs and improvements that increase the basic livability of the home, including additions and construction that makes the home safer, more energy efficient or more accessible to people with disabilities or people who are elderly.
- Remove or fix code violations, hook-up to municipal water and sewer systems and improve or install code-compliant septic or well systems.
- Payment for emergency repairs to critical life-safety in the homes, as long as the loan application is made to the Local Program Administrator within 30 days of the repair.
