## Beech President Receives Doctor of Humane Letters

Ken Scott, President and CEO of the Beech Companies was conferred upon an honorary doctorate degree by Lincoln University at its 158th commencement ceremony on Friday, May 12, 2017.

Ken was acknowledged for his work as President of the Beech Companies and his life achievements in social innovation producing over 2 billion dollars in community and economic development, the creation of thousands of jobs, millions in grants to charities/non-profit organizations and several hundred scholarships to deserving students to complete their higher education.

### North Philly's Premiere Music Fest Coming in August

The 11th annual "Jazz on the Ave" Music Fest featuring Philly Soul Stock will stretch along 5 blocks on Cecil B. Moore Avenue from Broad to 18th Streets on Saturday, August 12, 2017, (rain date August 13th) from 12-8:30pm. This free outdoor concert will have live music on two stages with an eclectic mix of Jazz, R&B, Soul and Funk music performed by talented local artists, Grammy nominated and Award winning artists. The main stage performers are Jeff Bradshaw & Friends with Tony Rich, Frank McComb, Eric Roberson, Glenn Lewis, and performances by Philly's own, Mozaic Flow and Suzann Christine.

As part of a health care initiative, the Stephen Klein Health Center and Drexel Health Systems will be on-site providing free preventative health and wellness screenings. The health tests will include blood pressure, diabetes screenings, and HIV/AIDS testing. Testing will be available between 12-5pm so, please be sure to get there early to beat the crowd.

The beauty of the "Jazz on the Ave" Music Fest is a blend of outstanding and exceptional music, family-friendly fun, a relaxed and neighborly atmosphere, all while people enjoy each other's company and the festivities of the event; like a children's zone that includes face painting, a rock climbing wall, clay sculpting, and craft and food vendors. The Philly Soul Stock stage will highlight up-and-coming talented young people from the Philadelphia and Metropolitan area. Patty Jackson and other Philadelphia notable radio and TV personalities will host the festival.

Christine Brown, event producer stated, "'Jazz on the Ave' is an excellent way to attract people to our community and it is a way for the residents to come together in fellowship and be proud of the rich musical heritage of this community, once known as "Jump Street." The festival continues to attract admirers from as far west as California and as far south as North Carolina. ### Home Loan Program for Philadelphia Residents

The Renovate & Repair Loan Program (R&R) is designed to meet serious housing issues for many of Pennsylvania's homeowners: how to make their home a healthy, comfortable place and a financial asset. The R&R Loan Program collaboration between PHFA & Beech has been developed to assist homeowners in avoiding common pitfalls in home improvement projects such as homeowners being taken advantage of by unscrupulous lenders and contractors, poor quality and unnecessary repairs.

#### Keystone Renovate & Repair Loan Program (R&R loan) is to help:

- Prevent homeowners from becoming victims of unscrupulous lending practices (i.e., high interest rates and costs, more money borrowed than needed, pre-payment penalties, etc.)
- Homeowners prioritize their home repair spending so that the work that they are having done is what the homeowner really needs. Improve Pennsylvania's aging housing stock for its current residents and future generations.

#### R&R loan can be used to:

- Pay for repairs and improvements that increase the basic livability of the home, including additions and construction that makes the home safer, more energy efficient, or more accessible to people with disabilities or people who are elderly.
- Remove or fix code violations, hook up to municipal water and sewer systems, and improve or install code-compliant septic or well systems.
- Payment for emergency repairs to critical life-safety systems in the homes, as long as the loan application is made to the Local Program Administrator within 30 days of the repair.

#### Features of R&R loan:

- Provide an attractive interest rate.
- Help determine the repairs and/or improvements to be done.
- Provides peace of mind in knowing that the right home repairs are done and were completed in a timely manner with quality workmanship.

#### R&R loan will not pay for:

- Luxury and cosmetic items such as hot tubs, pools, gazebos, etc.

### Local Non-Profits Receive Financial Support

During the Consortium of Cecil B. Moore Organizations luncheon meeting held on June 1, 2017, the Alston Beech Foundation (ABF) will award over \$20,000 in grants to local non-profits. Organizations receiving awards have shown considerable efforts that compliment and foster continued revitalization efforts in the Cecil B. Moore community of North Central Philadelphia.

The funds granted will be used for a variety of senior, youth, summer enrichment programs, and STEM programs. To be eligible for the ABF grant, organizations must be a non-profit and classified as tax exempt with a 501 (c) (3) status. For-profit organizations are not eligible for funding. #### The following organizations will receive grants:

**Alliance for Progress Charter School:** The school is a mission-driven, K-8 charter school, rooted in North Philadelphia. Founded in 1998 by the Women's Christian Alliance, a nonsectarian social service agency serving the community for more than 90 years, AFPCS is now an independent school that offers enhanced educational opportunities to children in surrounding neighborhoods and beyond.

**Blackhawks Athletic Club:** Is a youth basketball program for kids looking for sports as an extracurricular activity; providing youth with a positive self-image and an appreciation for collective work and responsibility using organized sports as a tool.

**The Business Center:** A 501(c)(3) that provides the education and business networking programs necessary to strengthen the business formation necessary to contribute to improving minority business ecosystem. The programs better position small businesses and startups to develop and vet their business concepts and further establish their reputations. TBC also provides youth entrepreneurship training and support to the environmental science program at George Washington Carver High School for Engineering and Science where students learn how to maintain a profitable greenhouse while also managing a business.

**Charles L. Blockson Afro-American Collection:** Is the nation's leading research facility for the study of the history and culture of people of African descent. This collection of over 500,000 items has materials on the global black experience in all formats: books, manuscripts, sheet music, pamphlets, journals, newspapers, broadsides, posters, photographs, and rare ephemera. In addition, the collection houses selected artifacts, such as statues and busts.

**The Educational Advocates Reaching Today's Hardworking Students (EARTH):** Provides fun, interactive reading and math workshops for North Philadelphia parents and their children from birth to third grade, to help build children's libraries, reinforce learning at home and encouraging experiential learning opportunities outside of the community.

**Friends of Bache-Martin:** Provides financial resources and facilitates community engagement to enhance the educational opportunities offered by the Bache-Martin school, and provides 7th grade students with mentors in leading workplaces that will support their academic journey with skill-building and resources to enter high school, college, graduate school, and enter their career.

**Give & Go Athletics RHD:** Offer sports and athletic programming to youth in grades 3rd-8th during out of school time. The program consists of after school sports at W.D. Kelley and Bache-Martin elementary schools as well as summer sports camp at W.D. Kelly elementary.

**Leon Sullivan Community Hoops & Conference:** Is a free three-day sports conference for children and families, with a community basketball game, educational workshops, health screenings, an all-star basketball skills clinic, and much more.

**Mercy Neighborhood Ministries of Philadelphia:** The Sisters of Mercy have worked in partnership with the working poor for more than 35 years resulting in partnerships and services that respond to the needs of those who are poor in the North Philadelphia community, especially women, children, and persons with special needs.

**North Broad Renaissance:** Is a voluntary service district whose primary role is to provide connection, communication, advocacy, and a clean and safe corridor along North Broad Street between the Germantown Avenue and City Hall.

**Parkside Saints Youth Sports and Mentoring Association:** Provides a positive and safe environment for youth to gain athletic, social, and personal skills that promote self-esteem and motivates youth to take pride in mentoring and give back to the future youth in their communities.

**Philadelphia Youth Network:** A citywide initiative managed by PYN to address the skills gap for vulnerable young people, providing career exposure and preparation opportunities to thousands of young people annually in the city of Philadelphia.

**Scribe Video Center:** Community groups from 10 neighborhoods in Philadelphia will work with a humanities scholar and video maker to collect and preserve community history interviews and develop a short media work about special landmarks that holds the community's memory and are in danger of being lost, and how to preserve those landmarks.

**Strawberry Mansion Neighborhood Action Center:** A nonprofit organization whose interest is to rebuild the community through the empowerment of residents and to enhance the quality of life by providing an array of services to low and moderate income families.

**Tree House Books:** A giving libraries and literacy center in North Philadelphia to help grow and sustain community readers, writers, and thinkers, while working to ensure that every child in Philadelphia has age appropriate books in their homes and that families spend time together reading.

On **Saturday, June 17, 2017** the *Philadelphia More Beautiful Committee (PMBC)*, part of the Streets Department's Sanitation Division, will continue its 2017 volunteer cleaning season with the second of three clean-ups scheduled for the 6th, 9th, 22nd, and 26th Police Districts. Block Captains and Community Group Leaders in the areas who wish to schedule their block(s) for the first clean-up are urged to call their PMBC Clean Block Officer three weeks in advance of the cleaning date. This cleaning season 2,037 volunteers have filled over 3,035 bags on 370 blocks during their cleaning activities. PMBC looks forward to working again with area neighbors and community groups in continuing their cleaning and beautification efforts. PMBC reminds citizens of the following tips when participating in Clean Block Events:

- All debris should be bagged and placed at either end of the block to facilitate collection
- No bulk or household trash will be collected during the Saturday Clean-Up Program
- Do not sweep trash or dirt into inlets
- Streets should not be blocked off with parked cars during cleaning

Blocks who wish to organize and elect a Block Captain, and blocks that wish to revitalize an inactive block club, should contact the Philadelphia More Beautiful Committee at (215) 685-3981. Upon request, the Clean Block Officer for your area will come out to help organize the block.
